FOF CELEBRATES 29 YEARS!

Happy 29th Anniversary, brothers and sisters; family and friends!

Events like anniversary celebrations remind us of Psalm 118:24, "this is the day the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad in it." Today is special. More than just another day, today we celebrate God's faithfulness and continued presence in the Family of Faith Community.

In 1993, 28 men and women decided to gather for the first time at the home of Ateng's brother and surely God blessed their time together. They had so much fun and there was a clamor to meet regularly to praise God and to fellowship. I was blessed to be a part of that group. We enjoyed each other's company every time we meet but we also experienced birthing pains when brothers and sisters started bickering why we are gathering and even about making plans to meet regularly. It caused misunderstandings. When the time came for us to ask the Lord for a name for our group, God gave us Galatians 6:10, "So then, while we have the opportunity, let us do good to all, but especially to those who belong to the family of the faith." Despite the differences we were having, God blessed us with unity of mind to accept unanimously the name, Family of Faith, as His gift to us.

The following year, 1994, we scheduled a day of recollection in our parish hall to ask the Lord for a vision of how He wants the FOF to be in the year 2000. But at the last minute the pastor of our parish informed me that we could no longer use the parish facility. We pushed through with the DOR at our pizzeria, which we converted into a conference room - we were creative, and we had food aplenty. We praised and worshipped our Lord and implored Him to speak to us. The Lord rewarded the sisters and brothers with a clear message that the FOF was going to be formed into a covenant community. The message came strong which included the need to form a leadership team to pursue the vision

We really did not know what to do but God sent us men and women to help us grow to become a covenant community even before the words “covenant community” was even revealed to us. We met Gus and Mely Marquez (LNP & POH) in the 1990s who introduced us to Felix Militante (founding member of POH) who connected us to the coordinators of POH and who convinced us to serve in the Couples for Christ. In 1993 Vic Gutierrez (Senior Head Coordinator-LNP) came to NJ and offered to help us. He introduced us to the elements of a Christian community and made sure we understood it well. Kuya Vic never ever suggested for us to become a community but urged us to always pray and listen to what God is speaking to us. In the year 2000, Fr. Benedict Worry welcomed us to St. Elizabeth of Hungary Parish after years of moving around 7 different parishes. Fr. Alex Cruz became our first spiritual adviser. In the early 2000, Eli Lademora came to us as our missionary coordinator to help us transition to becoming formally a SOS community. Kuya Eli as the representative of the SOS-Asian Region, turned over 3 communities, namely, the FOF, Tahanan ng Panginoon of Washington DC and Families for Christ of Dallas TX to Bob Tedesco who was then the president of SOS-NAR in a Tripartite Conference we hosted in the POCONOS. Bob Tedesco became our next missionary coordinator who years later turned us over to Jeff Smith and later to Marty Buganski who now is our Outside Coordinator.

I want to emphasize three things, *first*: Before we celebrated our 25th year anniversary we had a DOR to help prepare us for this momentous time in our community life. Brother Jude of the Brotherhood of Hope gave a talk that reminded us to always remember and be grateful for the men and women who carried us on their shoulder and helped us to become the community that we are today. If we cannot be grateful for these people, how can we ever become grateful to our God who sent them to us? The names that I mentioned are but a few of those that God brought to us. There are dozens more that you could probably recall. In your prayers, please ask the Lord to bless them and given the chance, call and thank them for their contribution to the FOF. Now, please look around you, at all those beautiful faces, and you will find a brother or a sister who may at one time, or another contributed to making you a better version of yourself or maybe one or two who extended to you a random act of kindness or maybe prayed for you at a time you needed it the most or maybe offered a shoulder to cry on or that someone listened emphatically as you vent out some emotions from your heart. Sisters and brothers, please, before the day is over walk over to that person or persons and express your gratitude to them and thank them for the goodness they extended to you and then give them a high five or a fist bump.

Secondly: Galatians 6:10 should be very important to all of us since our name came from these verses. "So then, while we have the opportunity, let us do good to all, but especially to those who belong to the family of faith." The call to us as a community is to take advantage of every opportunity to do good and be helpful to all people, but especially to those who are of the Family of Faith - your brothers and sisters in Christ. The word "especially" is used for emphasis. "Especially" is defined as "particularly" or "to a greater degree;" "extraordinarily" or "specifically." It should make sense then for all of us that to belong to FOF we also need to be intentional, be, to a greater degree, extraordinarily and specifically be good and helpful to one another. Anything less does not make it. Even having lots of good intentions do not count. It is only the "doing good" that matters. Doing good includes being a mirror to one another giving honest feedbacks, giving corrections and offering a different perspective on issues. That would require dialogue – a chance to have a conversation.

Thirdly: Let us pray for and support our leaders. Our leaders are our hope to make our mission and vision a reality. Also, our leaders will make it a reality for our community to experience anew the power of the Holy Spirit as envisioned for communities by Dave Hughes, president of SOS-NAR. He said, and I quote, "My overall conviction in the Lord is that he is preparing us for a season of awakening, revival, a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit in these days...to our own lives, to enliven our prayer times and prayer meetings." "Now...an encouraging word for us personally—there's plenty of deadness in us too: Dead idols that capture our hearts; Dead relationships that need restoring; Enshackling, ensnaring sins; Preach the gospel to those who are dead in their sins; Dead hopes, dead vision. Take heart, Jesus told us in the gospel of John that when he pours out the spirit, he pours it out without measure—there will be enough to go around. But when the Spirit is poured out, make no mistake, it is poured out to take that which is dead and make it alive."

Let us pray for:

-the casting of the fire: "One of the things that the Judgement of God is meant to do is to reveal the true nature of things. The fire will reveal the underlying nature. So too the Judgment of God in this sense reveals: The poverty of our self-reliance—we've got this! —no you don't, you're not that good." "So, when the Holy Spirit comes, when an awakening begins, when revival comes, part of what happens is the revelation of the judgement of God, an expression of his mercy to shake us and turn us while there is still time."

-the breaking of the dams: "We don't need more philosophical arguments; we need the gospel to do what only it can do: break through the dams and liberate those held captive to become sons and daughters of God." We must keep our eyes open to recognize those among us who are held captive by sin, or captive by pride or by greed or by pretense. It is easier to speak the truth now rather than making excuses later. Let us be instruments for change to break free those who are in bondage and in denial. We strive to win trust by being honest with each other and let us protect that trust. Let us do good and do what is right the first time.

-the rising of the tide: "In the SOS we are responding to a prophetic call to return to a greater reliance on the work and gifts of the Holy Spirit. For some, like me, there is an element of repentance involved. It's timely and profound and personal." The renewal, awakening and revival of our community starts with the renewal, awakening and revival of our hearts.

The Holy Spirit is coming to shake us, cast fire upon us, break our dams and raise the tide! Are you ready for it? Let us all, brothers and sisters, praise and thank God for He gave us each other to face it together in unity and be renewed together. Amen!

POG 24th Annual Summer Camp

This year's POG Summer Camp was my first time serving as a junior counselor, although I had been there many times as a camper. When I was a camper, my junior counselors impacted me a lot. All of my junior counselors were so cool and so friendly, and they were a big part of my experience in camp. They gave me such a wonderful experience as a camper, so I wanted to also give that experience to the campers in my cabin. Therefore, I put a lot of pressure on myself to be like my junior counselors in the past. I was comparing myself to them and also to the other counselors, so the first few days were hard because I thought everything was put on me. I was also worried about the Gathering for Christ. The junior counselors helped the head and assistant counselors in praying over the campers to receive the Holy Spirit, and I had never prayed over anyone in that way before. I was worried about all the right words to say, and I really wanted the campers to be impacted by the Holy Spirit. And again, I was putting everything on myself, and I thought that it was up to me to impact the girls. But God reminded me that these are His daughters. These are His children. He loves them and He will reveal Himself to them. And because He loves them and wants to reveal Himself to them, He will give me the right words. He has everything in His hands. When the Gathering for Christ came, all my worries about the right words to say were irrelevant. I feel like the words and the prayers just flowed out freely. I didn't really need to think about anything, but the Lord just gave me the words. After all the campers were prayed over, there was some extra time, so my cabin prayed over me. While I was being prayed over, I just felt God's tremendous love for me. He was telling me, "See? There's nothing to worry about. All your worries, I will take care of them. If I love you this much, what is there to fear? If I love you this much, why do you have to worry about anything?" And that goes for everything. If the Lord loves us so much, what is there to fear? **He will take care of us.**

I felt lacking and I didn't trust myself as a good example of what a "holy person" is. Despite my anxieties about serving, I was reminded to "fear not", like the theme verse says, "So do not fear, for I am with you".

On the very first day, there was a staff meeting and praise and worship. I felt that was God's response to my worries. One of the staff members encouraged us to allow God to take control and use whatever we offer in order to best serve the campers. So, I allowed that prayer and encouragement to carry me throughout the week.

Although I entered the camp still feeling nervous, I was surprised with great amount of joy. Mainly, I found joy in watching how God transformed the campers throughout the week which took place the most during praise and worship sessions. It became my favorite part of camp for a very different reason. Since I was a staff member, I was placed at the very back of the room. While singing, I found myself closing my eyes and slowly taking small steps back. I suddenly heard a voice tell me "Open your eyes", and there I saw all the children lined-up and praising the Lord. I think seeing that physical picture of people coming together to worship truly showed me how God is working throughout their lives. It was even more beautiful to see more and more hands raised, children singing louder, and some even jumping and dancing as the week went on. I especially noticed a difference after the Gathering for Christ. Seeing how the Holy Spirit impacted them, impacted me as well, and I was encouraged not to fear when praising God!

So, while I was preoccupied with being a good example and holy enough to serve as a staff member, the Lord taught me the importance of taking a step back. Taking a step back and witnessing God's work clearly gave me joy. I found joy in serving knowing that God is in control.

This is an excellent reminder on how and why we should be prodigal in forgiving anyone who had offended us – and even our own self.

“Resentment is like drinking poison and then hoping it will kill your enemies.” – Nelson Mandela

That quote from Mandela has helped me many a time. Knowing that holding a grudge toward another can be more harm to myself than to the person I am upset with and behooves me to move past resentment to a more compassionate stance.

Forgiveness is a virtue of the warrior spirit. It’s like taking a giant weight off your shoulders and the other person doesn’t necessarily have to change, say “thank you,” or otherwise. It’s no one’s duty but your own to clear out negative feelings and resentment, and your body-mind will thank you.

HERE ARE SOME FORGIVENESS AFFIRMATIONS TO HELP WASH AWAY THE PAIN OF RESENTMENT TO A MORE LOVING, FRESHER, CLEANER AND JOYFUL LIFE.

1. I am free from the prison of resentment.
2. Resentment replicates old turmoil and I choose my life to be drama free.
3. I do not confuse people from my past with people in the present.
4. I acknowledge my faults and forgive myself completely.
5. I make peace (inside) with anyone who has done wrong.
6. Forgiveness is a gift to myself.
7. I follow the principle of “live and let live.”
8. My parents did the best they could. I forgive them for any wrong that they unknowingly did and forgive myself for holding a grudge against them.
9. When I forgive myself, it becomes easier to forgive others.
10. Forgiveness gives me a fresh start and a clean slate.
11. I forgive to stop the negative karmic cycle in my life.
12. Each day is filled with new possibilities.
13. Today is the first day of the rest of my life.
14. The past is done. I now live in the present.
15. I am the architect of my future.
16. I am a pioneer of the future and not a prisoner of the past.
17. I am forgiving, loving, gentle and kind to everyone.
18. I lay down the heavy weight of doubt, shame, guilt, embarrassment and self-hate.

testimony of our Lord, nor of me a prisoner for His sake. But bear your
share of hardship for the Gospel with the strength that comes from God.
Take as your norm the sound words that you heard from me, in the faith
and love that are in Christ Jesus. Guard this rich trust with the help of the
Holy Spirit that dwells within us.

Brothers and sisters, I sense that as a body, as a community, we are
reminded again of the love and works of the Holy Spirit that is within us.
Should we feel disillusioned, discouraged, disappointed or have given up
the fight, remember these words – the gift of God, the gift of His Holy
Spirit is within us, is with us. Together as a community, let's tap into the
